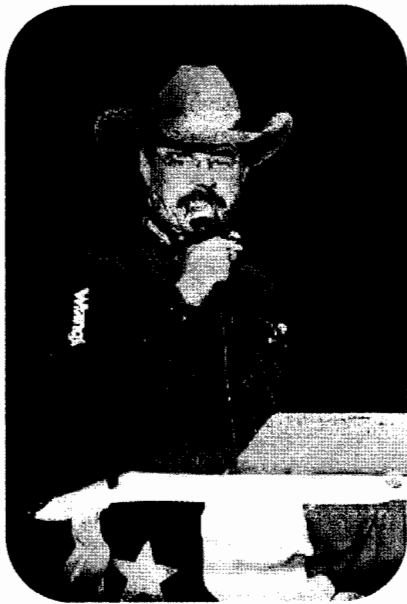

Mr. Randy Corley has been a great friend of Prescott Frontier Days, Inc. for the past 34 years as the “voice” of the World’s Oldest Rodeo. He is a rodeo legend and professional rodeo announcer who comes with great integrity and knowledge about the sport of rodeo.

In 2017, Randy was inducted into the ProRodeo Hall of Fame and has been nominated and awarded the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association (PRCA) Announcer of the Year twelve times (1984, 1990-1996, 1998, 2003, 2011 and 2015).

He was born in 1951 in Miles City, Montana. While in high school, he decided to take a speech class for an easy credit, and when asked to give a speech it was always rodeo-related about world champions like Larry Mahan or Jim Shoulders. The teacher did not approve.

“She had threatened me a couple of times that I needed to talk about something different,” Corley recalled. “I’d always come back to rodeo. One time, she couldn’t take it anymore. When I started yet another speech on rodeo, she came running up and ripped the speech off the podium, and said, you’ve got to think about your future. You’re not going to talk rodeo your whole life.” Little did she know, Corley would make his living “talking rodeo.”

In 1977-78, he attended the Ron Bailey School of Broadcast in Seattle, WA then worked as a DJ in Broken Bow before moving to North Platte, Nebraska where he was on air at KODY AM and KX 104. Today, he and his wife Michelle live in Seattle, WA.

Randy is active year-round announcing professional rodeos (big and small) across the United States and is one of the announcers at the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo (NFR) in Las Vegas every year, 16 times to be exact (1985-86, 1992, 1994-96, 2007-2017). The NFR is the “super bowl” of rodeos and draws people from all over the world to watch this exciting event.

His knowledge, talented voice and engaging personality makes every person attending the rodeo feel welcome and included in the action taking place.

It is an honor to have Randy Corley each year at the Prescott Frontier Days and we are very thankful to have his talent in our Rodeo arena each and every year.

Honorary Pioneer Family

The Buchanan's

► In the fall of 1946 the Buchanan family of George, Julia (Julie), and young sons Buck and Jim made the journey from New York to Prescott, Arizona. The move was made due to George's Asthma, he had two years to live but only if he moved to Prescott, Arizona. He did and lived for 18 years passing in 1965.

► George pursued his expertise in real estate. In 1947, while listing the 160 acre "Sun down Ranch" which had at that time an unlivable home the lady seller and he reached an agreement to purchase "Sundown Ranch". An interesting part of the sale was while in attorney Harold Wolfinger's office above the bank at Gurley and Cortez Streets, she announced she was going downstairs to stand on the front steps of the bank and would sell the note she was going to carry for 50% of the value. George spoke to the banker who was happy to lend 50% of the value of the note. George and Julie worked on the place for a year until the fall of 1948.

► They did not have electricity in those early years, no phone until 1964 and then it was an eight party line! George worked in Prescott at various jobs including real estate sales, Planning and Zoning Director for both the City of Prescott and Yavapai County and George Buchanan Mortgage business. George and later Buck were active in the Prescott Rotary Club.

► After George's passing, Julie implemented a plan George conceived to develop "Sundown Acres", the old Sundown Ranch. It was the first subdivision in Yavapai County to have underground electric and telephone! Julia sold lots for many years for her income. Her last 8 wonderful years were spent in the Arizona Pioneer's Home.

► Buck and Jim still reside in "Sundown Acres" today. Buck and Jim attended Miller Valley School as did most of their children. Jim has wonderful memories of the Trujillo's at their home just over the fence from the current day home of Prescott Frontier Days, World's Oldest Rodeo where JC Trujillo is now general manager. Frankie and JC had a bucking barrel in their back yard where they and friends all tried their luck at riding the bucking barrel. Jim remembers a day one of the ropes broke and the barrel slammed into him knocking him out!

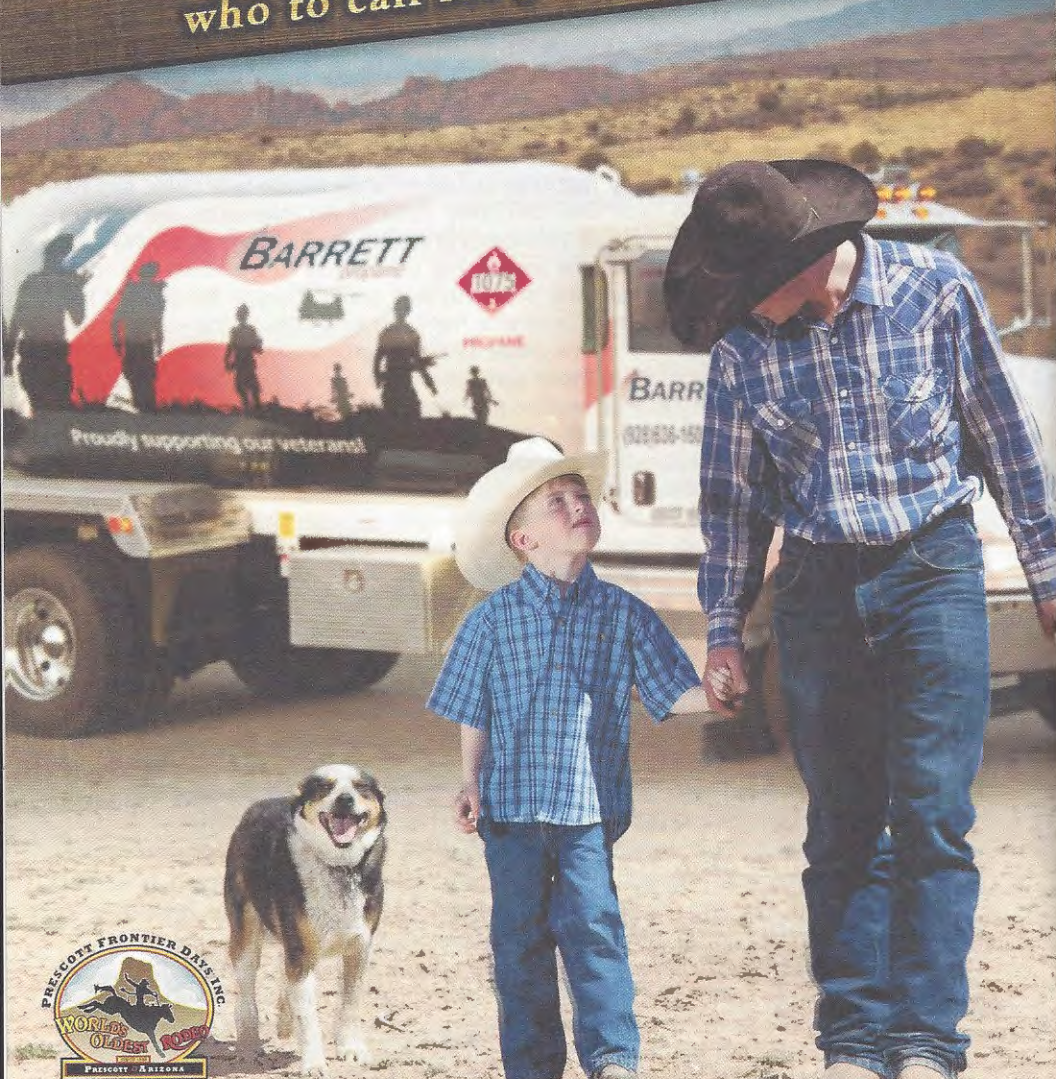
► He moved back to Prescott and went to work as a Policeman rising to the rank Lieutenant and retired after 23 years. He then was elected Yavapai County Sheriff, serving 16 years until retiring. Married to Sheila, Buck has 4 children, 6 grandchildren and 2 great grandchildren.

► Jim worked sixteen years in the auto service business, later spending most of his career in financial planning and investments where he worked until retiring. He is proud to have been active with many local non-profit organizations including Frontier Rotary Club, Prescott Frontier Days Committee where he served on the 1988 Centennial year Board of Directors, Prescott Western Heritage Foundation and Arizona Cowboy Poets Gathering.

► Married to Barb, they have 6 children, 15 grandchildren and 18 great grandchildren.
